Amitav Acharya is interested in the diffusion of ideas and norms in world politics, comparative study of regions and regional institutions, international relations of Southeast Asia, and non-Western international relations theory. He was Vice-President of ISA in 2008-2009, and a member of ISA's Professional Rights and Responsibilities Committee in 2009-2010. He grew up in India, and was educated in India (Ravenshaw and Jawaharlal Nehru) and Australia (Murdoch). He was Professor of Political Science at York University, Toronto and Professor of Global Governance at the University of Bristol, UK. He has taught at universities in Asia (Singapore, Malaysia & Thailand), Africa (South Africa), Australia, Europe (UK) and North America (Canada and USA).
